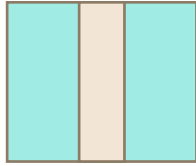
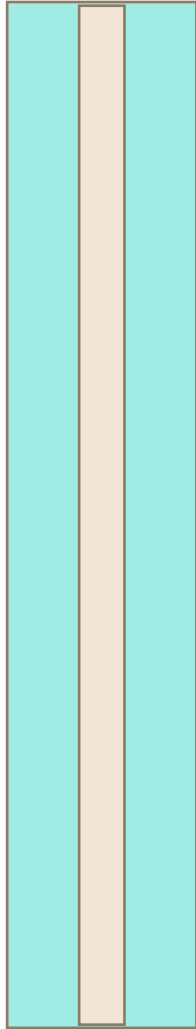


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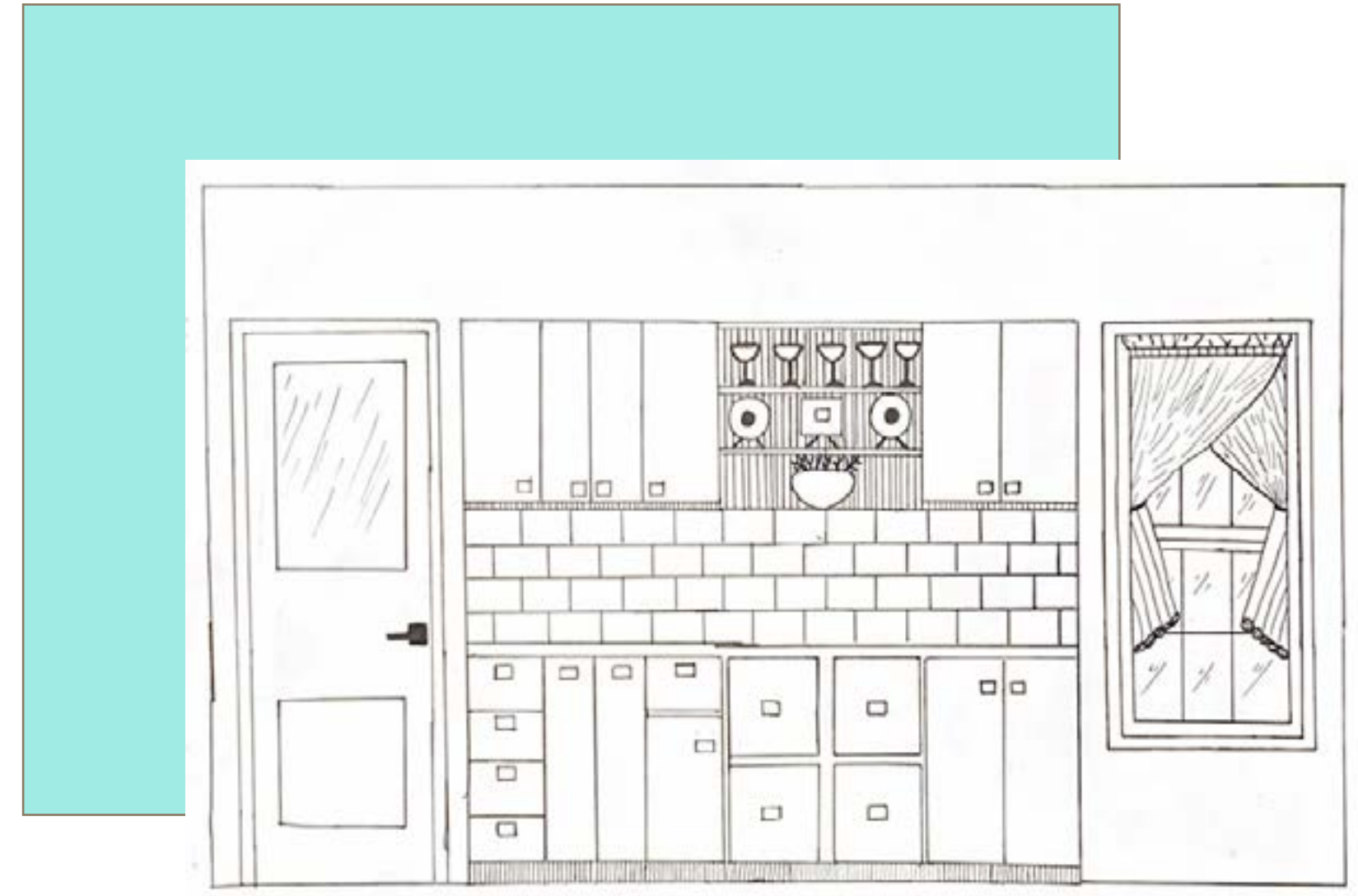
HELLO!

Elevation 1

Project 1 put my drawing skills to the test to create a kitchen elevation with a door, window, and cabinets. I explored detailing with an open shelving display unit in the wall cabinets. I drew thick tiles for the backsplash and used crossing curtains on the window. The cabinet surfaces were plain as to not take away from the other parts of the elevation. I added glass detailing on the vision door and on the individual panels of the window between the muntins. Line detailing was placed under the cabinets to show the depth of the toe kick.

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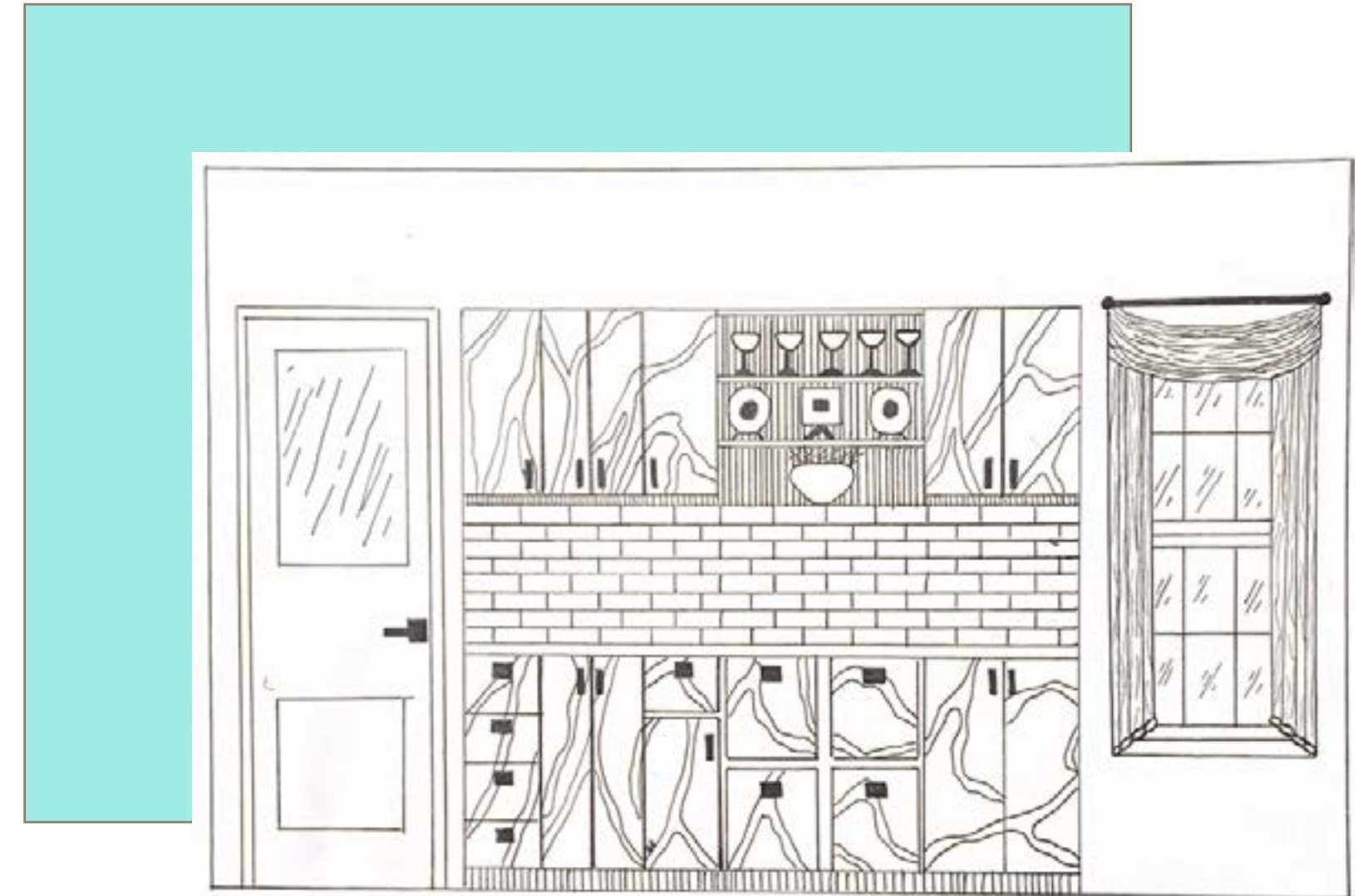


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Project 2:

This project was an expansion of the first kitchen elevation. This project was to try and better the first. The basic layout remained the same, but I was challenged to add more detail and change the tile and cabinetry. I created smaller more brick-shaped tiles on the backsplash and explored wood detailing on the cabinets. I made the curtains a little longer and hung them differently at the top. The window was drawn a little different in the second project in order to incorporate a bar for the longer curtains.

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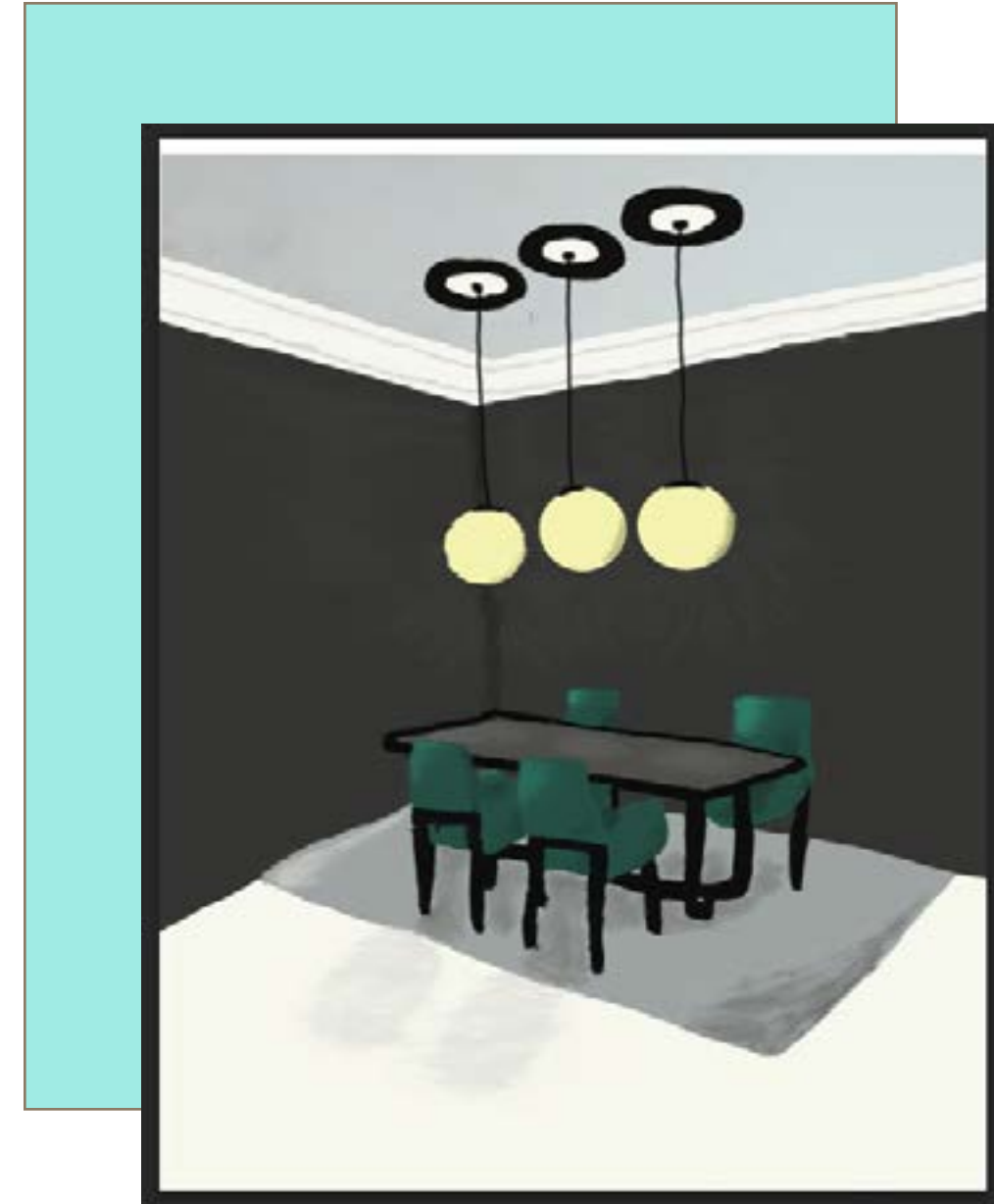


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Project 3:

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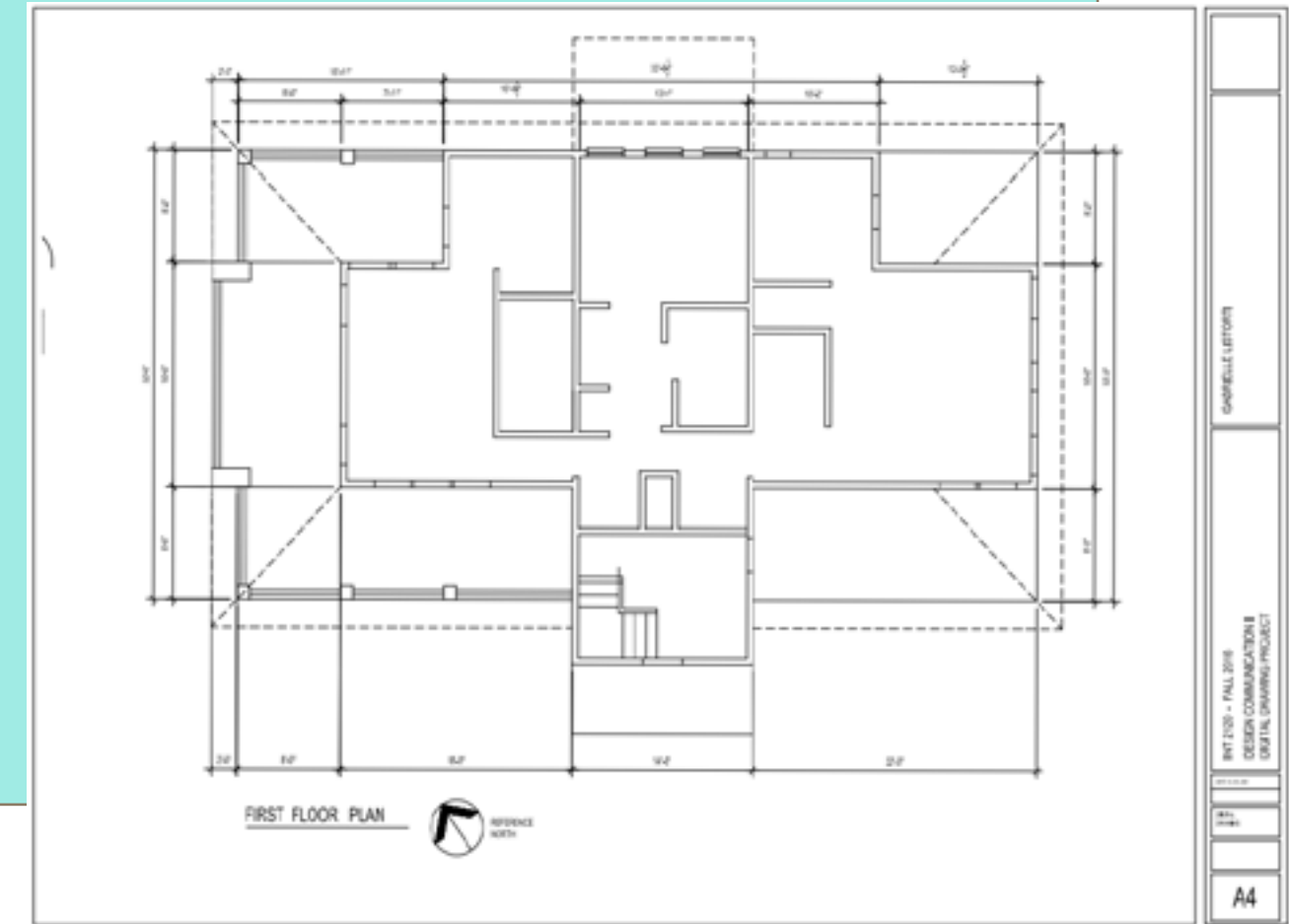


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Project 4:

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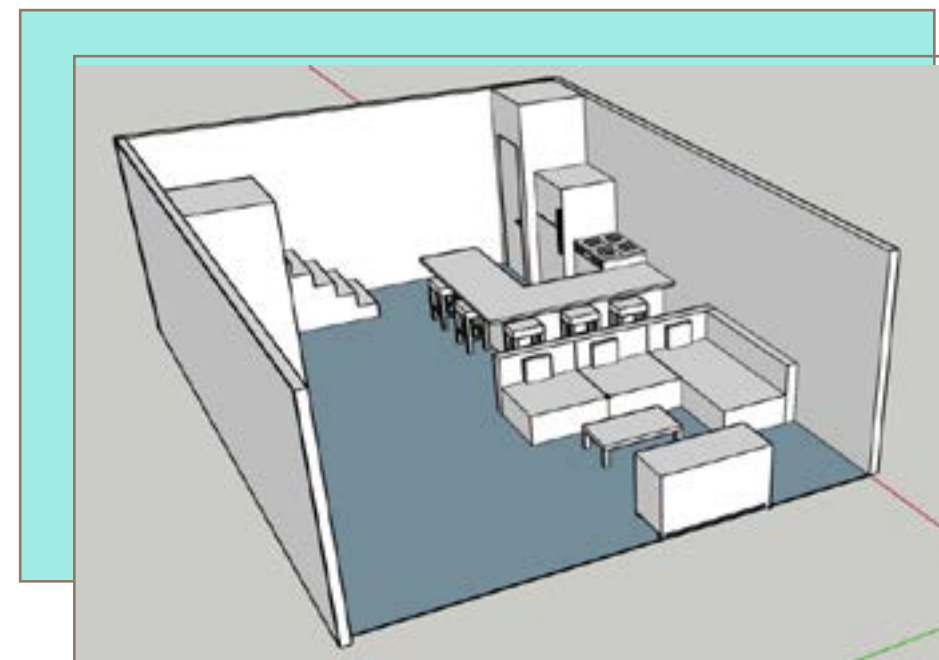

Floor 1

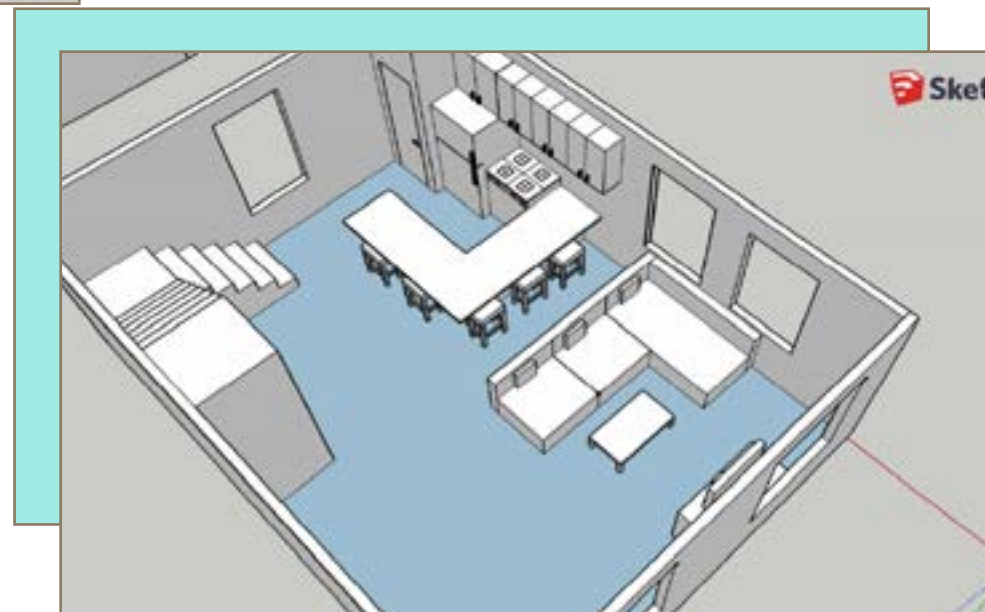

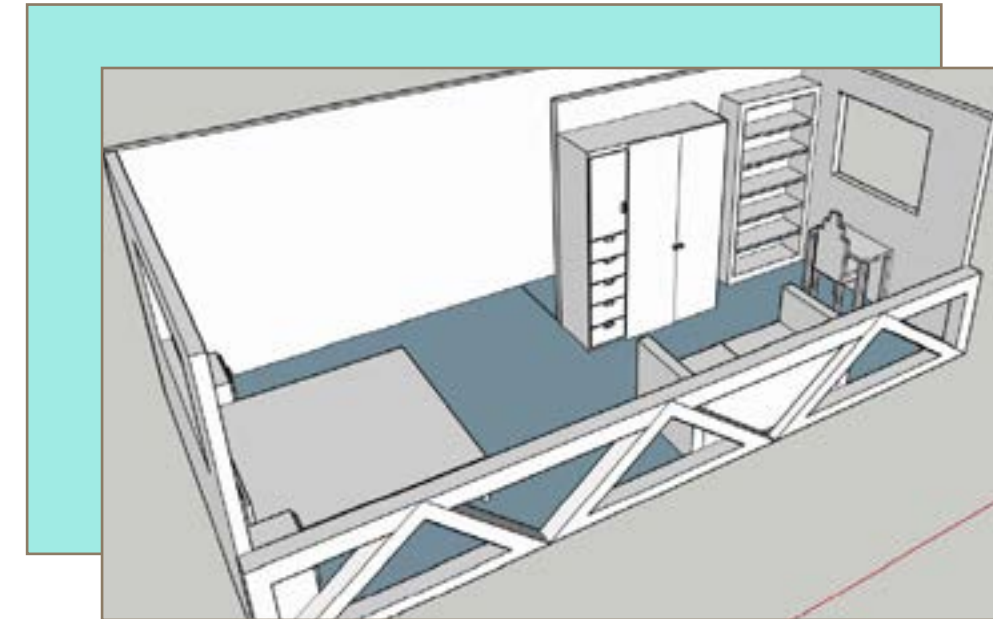


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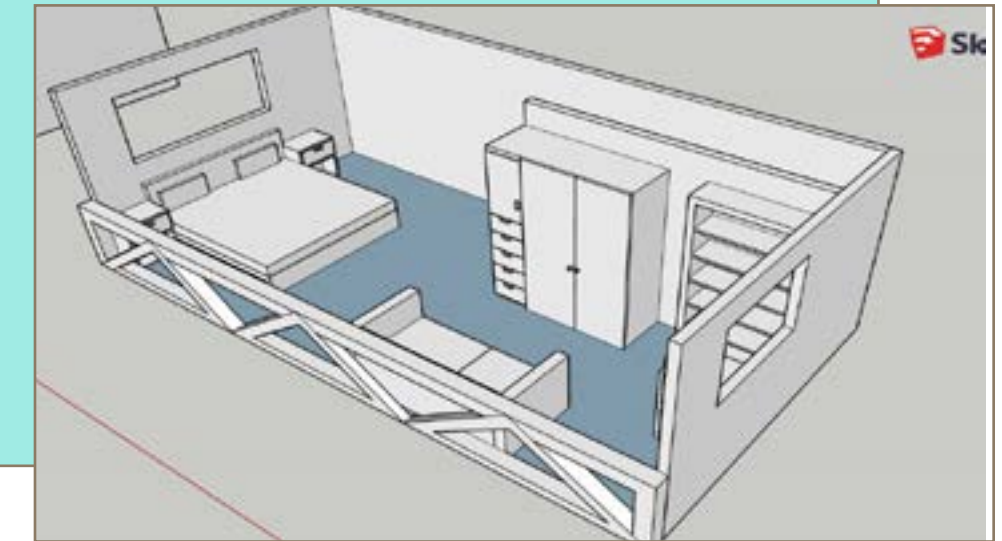

Project 6 was a midterm project from this year. I had to design a one-story residential space. This included an entrance hall with bathroom, living room, dining room, kitchen and dinette area, private back hall, and master bedroom with a bathroom. In the bedroom I included a bed, night tables, dresser, standing armoires, and wall decor. The dining room has a beautiful cherry wood china closet, long wooden dining table with chairs, and wall art. Lastly, the kitchen/dinette area has an open floor space plan that connects both rooms for a more spacious feel. The kitchen includes all appliances, counters, and shelving. I added a high island with stools to match, and a semi-circular dining booth nook.

The second part of Project 6 was the creation of a commercial space for a textile designer. This space included a waiting room, public bathroom, display room, private office/workspace, conference room, private kitchen, and bathroom. The waiting room had a receptionist corner with rounded desk, comfortable chairs and coffee table, oriental rug, and geometric shelving for a pop of modern art. The conference room holds a “U” shaped table accompanied by many swivel chairs, shelving units, and a TV stand for displaying products. The Private workspace area has a desk for business and personal needs, a beak area with comfy chairs and a leather couch, and coffee table. At the back of the office sits a long worktable and stools for design work. Lastly the break room is set-up with a mini kitchenette which includes a refrigerator, microwave, countertops, and a convection oven. In the back of the space are three tables with chairs for enjoying a meal. Opposite the tables sit a couch and comfy chair over a plush rug for premium break and relaxation time during a busy day.

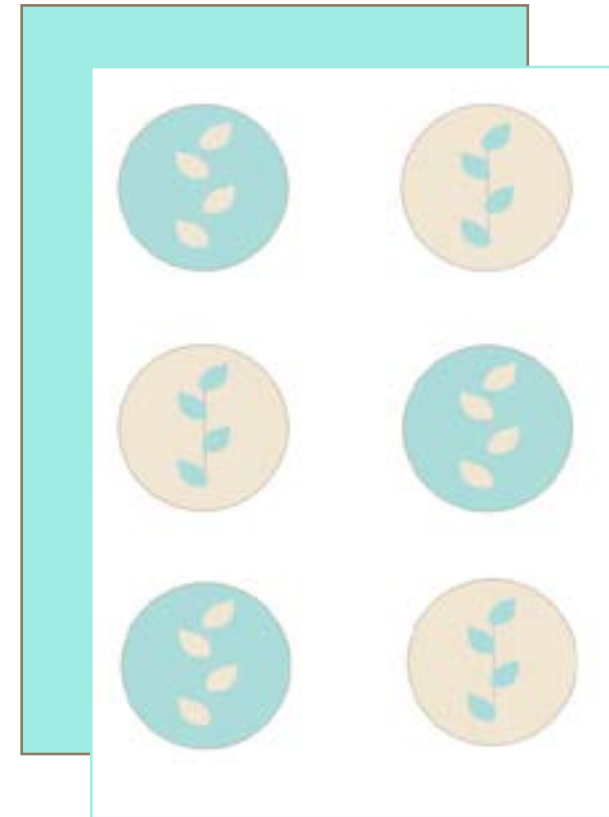

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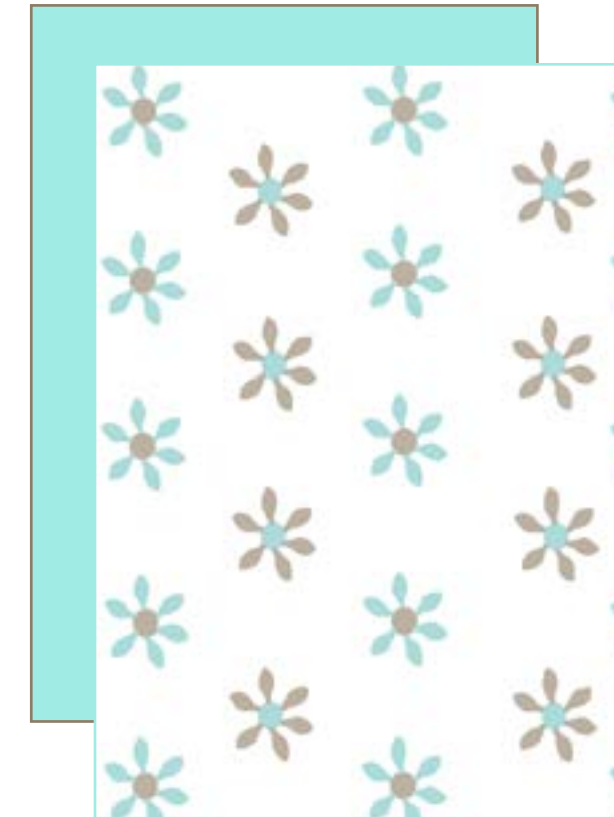

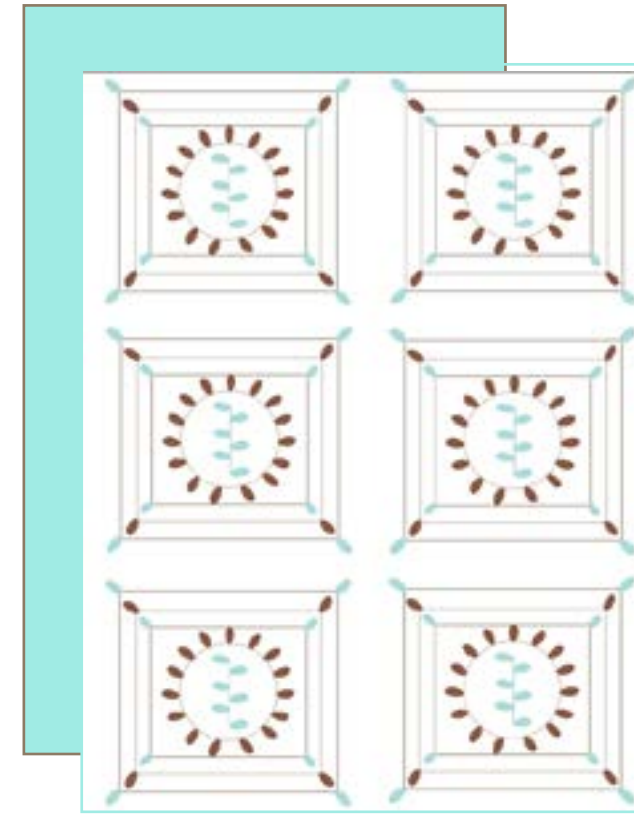

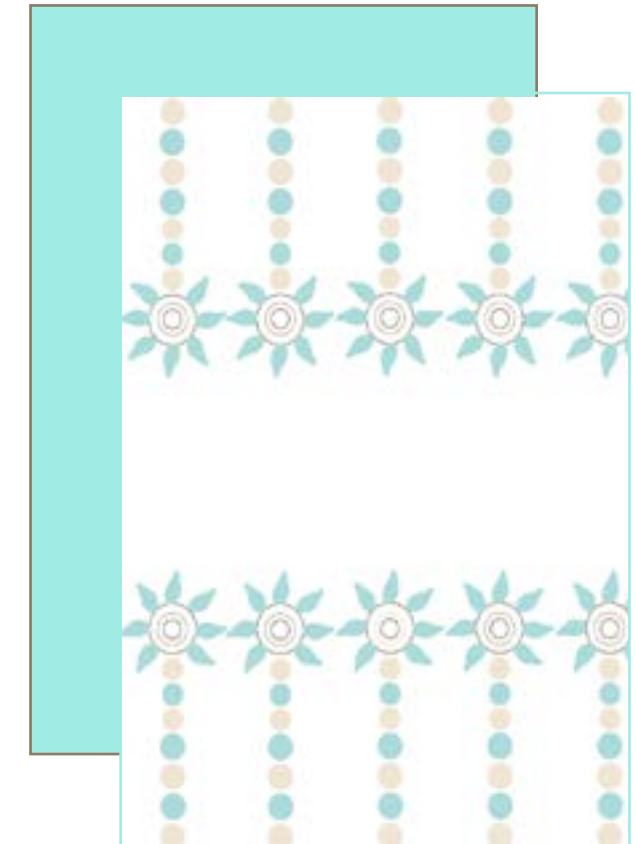
